Texas Unites offers quality professional development to meet the needs of our diverse audience. Workshop proposals may be submitted on any aspect of animal welfare. Texas Unites traditionally offers content in the following areas.

General Conference Tracks

Designed for all in the animal care & control, sheltering and rescue community. Participants come from all aspects of animal welfare, including municipal shelters, private shelters, rescue groups, veterinary clinics, law enforcement agencies and others. Shelter Medicine

Designed for Veterinarians and Certified Veterinary Technicians who are interested in shelter medicine and/or those who are currently working collaboratively with shelters, rescue groups, and other animal welfare organizations. These courses must be taught by a Veterinarian.

Executive Leadership

Designed for Executive Directors, CEOs and board members to support the growth and development of their organizations. We encourage submissions from business and nonprofit professionals both within and outside of the animal welfare community.

PROPOSAL FORMAT AND SELECTION PROCESS

To be considered as a speaker, your program must be educational in nature (sales presentations will not be accepted). Your material should be original; otherwise, sources must be referenced. While some topics may be challenging and provide an opportunity for lively discussion, your content must be respectful and appropriate for all participants in the animal welfare community.

Programs should last one and one-half hours, including a brief session for questions and answers. Multi-session and multi-speaker programs are welcome.

Proposals will be accepted through September 17, 2024. Please submit your proposal using our online form: http://www.texasunites.com/apply-to-speak/. You will be asked to attach a 1-2 paragraph workshop description, a 1-2 paragraph bio for each speaker, a headshot, and a list of previous events or groups for which you have spoken.

Please provide information EXACTLY as you would like it to appear in Texas Unites for Animals promotional materials. Incomplete proposals may not be considered.

Proposals are reviewed by a selection committee and selections will be made in the fall months. You will be notified of the status of your proposal by the end of December.

Texas Unites is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. We are committed to maintaining a modest conference registration fee so that cost is less likely to be a barrier to participation. Texas Unites for Animals does not pay per diem, honoraria, or travel expenses for speakers. If selected as a conference speaker, you will gain visibility in the industry and contribute to the advancement of our profession. Texas Unites does, however, provide complimentary conference registration for our speakers, including several meals and entry to workshops and special events.
